#YouSaid speeding and road safety is an issue for residents

PC Edd McKinnon regularly patrols the part of the A1 that passes through Rutland. Here is a taster of what he has been up to. An HGV had a full set of tyres blow out across a full axle; this left the lorry in a dangerous position on a fast road. PC McKinnon attended and noticed that after putting cones and signs up many drivers leave it so late before changing lanes. Several motorists will be receiving letters or a Traffic Offence Report (for use of mobile phone), whilst driving.

PC McKinnon then attended several incidents on the A1 (with PC Jake Spruce), that kept him on the road for most of his shift. The first incident was at the northern edge of our border and involved cars crashing into the central reservation. Nobody was hurt but it took a while to clear. The next incident attended by PC McKinnon and PC Spruce was a broken down vehicle on the northbound slip at Tinwell, as Edd and Jake finished dealing with this incident another one came in half a mile down the road from this. This involved two vehicles and again took a while to deal with. Again no-one was injured.
