

Consultations and Surveys

Here are some consultations and surveys that may be of interest to individuals and organisations:

- Rutland County Council is asking residents to take part in the latest <u>Childcare</u>
 <u>Sufficiency Assessment</u> to help determine if early education and childcare is meeting the needs of parents and carers who are working, studying or seeking employment. The consultation runs until 23 May.
- The Government is seeking views on the approaches it should consider around reform of the health and disability benefits system and employment support. The consultation closes at 11:59pm on 30 June.

- The Low Pay Commission is inviting submissions to inform its recommendation to the Government on minimum wage rates in 2026 and beyond. The consultation closes at 11:59pm on 30 June.
- The Government is consulting on a <u>draft code of practice covering requests for a victim's third party material and the definition of counselling services</u>. The consultation closes at 11:59pm on 1 July.
- The Government is seeking views on options for <u>simplifying</u>, <u>modernising and</u>
 <u>reforming HMRC's approach to dispute resolution</u>. The consultation closes at

 11:59pm on 7 July.
- The Government wants to hear ideas about how to make cancer care better for
 everyone to help make a national cancer plan for England and has published an Easy
 Read call for evidence. The call for evidence closes at 11:59pm on 14 July.
- NHS England are looking for feedback on the experience and the support individuals
 have received when accessing crisis care services through the NHS 111 'select mental
 health option' service. The survey closes on 15 July.
- The Department of Health and Social Care is seeking views to inform a Men's
 health Strategy for England. The call for evidence closes at 11:59pm on 17 July.
