Op Strive Tarmac Scam

An emerging issue for Leicestershire and Rutland residents is Op Strive. This refers to what is known as a 'tarmac scam'. Offenders will claim to be from Highways England or a similar legitimate firm. Sometimes they will ask to store plant equipment / tarmac or top dressing at a farm or rural location. Other times they will simply start to 'tarmac' a victims driveway. A demand is then made for an overinflated price with threats if payment isn't made. If you are a victim of this type of crime then please let us know. There are often associated offences of blackmail, harassment or criminal damage. All offences are linked together so that we can pursue all and any lines of enquiry.

Community Meetings

Over the winter months, we aim to host a number of community meetings covering the force area. We welcome attendance from anyone within the rural community so that they can have a voice and an opportunity to air any concerns or local issues. Please keep a look out on our socials and local Whatsapp groups for more information.

Finally...

Acquisitive crime across the force area is relatively low at the moment, but please don't get complacent. If GPS domes aren't needed for long periods of time. Remove them. Close and lock gates and sheds. Take some responsibility for your own security—quality locks / lights and CCTV. Trust your barking dog in the early hours. We hit £1 million of rural recoveries last month (stolen recovered property) but ideally—we don't want things to be stolen in the first place.

We are accessible and accountable and want to make sure that crime stays low, but we need to help each other. You can find ways to contact us overleaf.
